6. Extension to HMP Garth

It is understood the funding has now been released for the extension to HMP Garth and work will be starting shortly. The contact from the Prison Authority is visiting on the 15 and 16 June 2005 and has offered to meet with representatives of the Parish Council to brief on progress and discuss any other matters of concern. Members are asked to give this consideration.

7. QP Investment Fund

8. Sand Extraction – Euxton

Members will recall it was agreed at a previous meeting to offer support to Euxton Parish Council in commenting on the proposed sand extraction. Euxton have now made a submission to Lancashire County Council (the relevant planning authority) a copy of which is attached. Members are asked to decide how best to comment on the proposals.

9. Litter Bins

Chorley Borough Council has allocated the Parish two new post mounted litter bins. Members are asked to consider where these may be best located. Three sites have already been suggested – near to the Club; the entrance to Wymott Park and the lay-by at the north end of Ulnes Walton Lane.

11. Matters Raised at the Parish Assembly Requiring Attention

The following issues were raised by members of the public at the Parish Assembly, Members are requested to consider how best to deal with the matters.

a) Bus Shelter Southport Road

Problems were being experienced with youths congregating, using that shelter as a toilet and setting a fire.

b) Ulnes Walton Lane

- Concern over the number of vehicles leaving the prison complex at speed. Also considerable numbers of heavy vehicles were using Ulnes Walton Lane despite the weight limit.
- Calls for a mobile speed camera along Ulnes Walton Lane.
- Speed limit sign on Ulnes Walton Lane damaged by a fallen tree.
- Concern over the danger to motorists and the horses by the carriage driving along the Lane
- The cat's eyes along Ulnes Walton Lane needed to be replaced.
- Smell of sewage near to Marsh House.
