ITEM 9 CHORLEY BOROUGH AREA FORUM

a) Lostock Newsletter

In preparation for the next Area Forum, Chorley Borough Council is intending to produce a newsletter for Lostock Ward highlighting the issues discussed at the last Forum. The Borough Communications Officer has advised that it is the intention to publish contact details of all the Parish Councillors in the newsletter.

Whist it is accepted that in taking up 'Public Office' it is important that contact details of Councillors should be made available through the Parish Council website and newsletters, an opinion needs to be formed as to whether Members wish to have details published and indeed if it is necessary, on a wider basis.

ITEM 9(i) LANCASHIRE LOCAL

Members may recall being consulted earlier in the year on the intentions of Lancashire County Council to establish a Lancashire Local for the Chorley Area. Papers have arrived detailing the arrangements for the first meeting to take place on THURSDAY 15 JUNE 2006 at 6.30 pm in St Mary's Parish Centre Devonshire Road Chorley.

It is not clear what role the parish councils will play in the Forum, the papers state 'The County Council is working with City, District and Borough Councils across Lancashire to strengthen democratic accountability through empowering locally elected councillors to take decisions and shape and influence the delivery of local government services in each area'. It is however apparent that there are huge implications for parishes in decisions taken by this panel.

The meeting is open for Parish Councillors to attend and speak on items on the agenda. Members are asked to consider whether or not the Parish Council should be represented at this meeting, bearing in mind it is on the same evening as the Parish Cohesion meeting.

ITEM 12 PLANNING – NEW APPLICATIONS

Application for Certificate Of Lawfulness For Stable Block At Ash House Farm

Members may recall that application was made to build stables at this site, which was refused.

The applicant proceeded to construct stables within what was believed to be permitted development but was then requested to submit a retrospective application by Chorley Borough which was again refused and an enforcement order issued.

The owner has now submitted application for a Certificate of Lawfulness claiming that the development is within the curtilage of the property and that buildings have previously occupied the site.

Appeal against the Enforcement Notice for the Removal of Caravan from Lostock Bridge Farm

Appeal has been made to the First Secretary of State against the enforcement notice issued by Chorley Borough Council for the removal of the caravan sited at Lostock Bridge Farm.
