- A tractor has a lot of momentum know your stopping distance
- Be aware of your width especially with a trailer or implements
- Keep well below the speed limit on narrow roads, especially at night
- Slow down if debris is likely to fall from tyres or chassis
- Be aware multiple light clusters can blind oncoming traffic
- Be courteous to other users of narrow lanes



Motorists

- Please do not overtake if you cannot see the road ahead
- Keep well to the left on approaching a bend
- Do not speed – these roads are dangerous with many blind spots
- Slow down near horses, cyclists and pedestrians and give them a **wide berth**
- Expect slow moving traffic near joining side roads
- **Do not cut corners**
- **BE PATIENT**



Motor Cyclists

- As for motorists

PLUS

- Keep to the speed limit
These roads are used by farm vehicles and horses so tyre grip may be sporadic
- Take especial care near horses because of louder exhausts

Cyclists

- Keep in single file near bends
- Keep well to the left
- Use lights and light clothing at night



Pedestrians

- Try and face the oncoming traffic – if it is not safe to do so take extra care near bends
- Stop and listen near blind bends
- Make sure you can be seen especially at night



Equestrians

- It is always safer to ride in single file on a narrow lane – even if the road looks clear there may be speeding or overtaking traffic
- Be vigilant – except in an emergency do not use mobile phones on a busy road
- Take extra care approaching and leaving bends
