



Where have all the flowers gone?

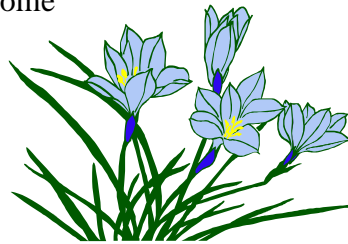
Would you like to see more wild flowers in Ulnes Walton?
Then read on -

The humble bee is a species in serious decline, primarily due to the disappearance of many of their food plants. Plans are afoot to embark on a parish wide wild flower project with a view to increasing the number of flowers growing in the parish but with the prime aim to improve the habitat for the bees.

Lottery funding is to be sought by Action for Ulnes Walton to enable the project to go ahead. Plans are still in the early stages but here are a few ideas that have been put forward for inclusion in the grant bid -

- A parish wide survey to establish exactly what we already have
- A fact finding trip to the National Wild Flower Centre
- Wild Flower workshops covering identification and the medicinal uses of wild flowers
- A wild flower and bee awareness fun day
- Workshops covering identification and medicinal uses of wild flowers
- And of course planning of wildflower seeds throughout the village

The list is not exclusive and new ideas are welcome
Please let the Parish Council or any member
of Action for Ulnes Walton know your
ideas as soon as possible as the grant
application will be submitted in the
next few weeks.



If the grant application is successful it is hoped the project will start in Spring 2005.
